

Low Light/Combat Handgun Event

Treasure Coast Public Safety Training Complex

This is a combat/low-light event. Competition will begin from the 10 yard line. Two shooters will compete at a time with a 20 yard space between them. The competition will require two magazines with six rounds each. Weapons will be placed on a provided table with an uncharged magazine. The competition will begin when the range lights are set to the low-light position. Competitors will turn 180 degrees, pickup and charge their weapon, activate their flashlight and engage in a discretionary identification of three targets, two of which are engage able, one of which is a non-shoot. After firing six rounds, there will be a mandatory reload before firing the final six rounds. Competitors will have 10-seconds to complete the course.

Scoring will be on a point system only. Highest score wins the category. You will have one chance to compete. Scoring will be counted by the range master. Only fours and fives will be counted. For each hit on the non-shoot target, two points will be deducted. Disqualification will occur if the competitor does not engage their flashlight or if more than six rounds are loaded in each magazine. Upon completion of the 10 second course targets will turn and lighting will be restored. All firing must cease, magazines must be removed from weapons, slides must be locked back and weapons placed down range for inspection.

In the event of a scoring tie, five yards will be added and the course will be repeated by the tying competitors.

- Competitors must bring the own eye and ear protection.
- No food, drink or tobacco products in range.
- Competition is opened to male and female competitors.
- Firearms allowed: 9mm, .40, .45 (no .22). Flashlight must be attached.
- Ammunition allowed: factory only, ball ammo, full metal jacket.
